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## CIVIL WAR

Arnold, Alexander C.

[Civilian stone: “Alexander C. Campbell, 1846 – 1941, Co H 24 th Ky Inf”; death certificate on Find A Grave website give full name as “Alexander Campbell Arnold”]

Barnett, Moses M.

[Civilian stone: “Moses M. Barnett, Co. F 7th Ky Inf, Born Apr 30, 1840, Died Apr 28, 1903”; Find A Grave website adds: “Laurel Co. Judge; 32nd Degree Mason”]

Cassidy, John

[no stone for John Cassidy, but there is a John W. Casady, 1841-1925; no other information]

Davis, Andrew Jackson

[Civilian stone: “Andrew Jackson Davis, 1846 – 1936; no military information]

Floyd, James Corbin

[Civilian stone: “James Corbin Floyd, May 10, 1940 – Feb 9, 1911”; A newspaper article posted on Find A Grave website adds the title “Reverend”, and states that the city of Corbin, KY, was named for him; and he was a veteran of the Union Army, Civil War]

Johnson, Andrew Jackson

[Civilian stone: “Andrew Jackson Johnson, Mar 15, 1840 – Sep 22, 1918;” information from Branches of Laurel Vol. III, No. 1, Jan., 1988 by the Laurel County Historical Society: “Pvt. Co. G. 5th Ky. Vol. Inf., CSA”; this source also has death date as Jun 22, 1918]

Johnson, John Patton

[Civilian stone: “John P. Johnson, Nov 20, 1868 – Mar 6, 1950; born 3 years after the end of the Civil War; maybe he is a WWI veteran? This is the only John P. Johnson in Locust Grove.]

Martin, Joel [Poster adds “Marion” as middle name]

[Union military stone: “MUSN, Joel Martin, Co. F. 16th Ky. Inf.”; no dates on stone; website gives dates as 1822 – Jul 26, 1894; MUSN stands for “Musician”]

Masters, Reuben B.

[Union military stone: “Reuben B. Masters, Co. K. 3 W Va. Cav.”; no birth or death dates]

McFarland, Wallace

[could not find a stone for Wallace McFarland in Locust Grove Cemetery on Find A Grave website; there is a Union stone for a George W. McFarland, which is probably the same man, since George is not on the poster; stone inscription says “CO F 16<sup>th</sup> KY INF”; no dates on stone, but Find A Grave website lists dates as Jan 13, 1842 – Jul 3, 1916; source is death certificate]

Parker, James W.

[could not find a stone for James W. Parker in Locust Grove Cemetery on Find A Grave website; he is possibly the same man as Wallace Parker, below]

Parker, Wallace

[Union military stone: “Wallace Parker, Co. B. 49 Ky. Inf.”; no dates on stone; Find A Grave website gives dates as: Mar 6, 1843 – May 25, 1917]

Polly, James W. [Find A Grave gives middle name as “Wesley”]

[Union military stone, “Corpl. Jas. W. Polly, Co. H 24 Ky. Inf.”; no dates on stone; Find A Grave website gives dates as 1830 – May 7, 1906]

Stevens, Thomas L.

[Civilian stone: “Thomas L. Stevens, Born Aug 22, 1839 – Died Jan 21, 1914”; no military information]

Storm, Isaac R. [Poster says middle name is “Reece”]

[Military marker: “Isaac R. Storm, Co. H. 24 Ky. Inf., Civil War, Apr 25, 1846 – Sep 21, 1929”]

Trosper, James Ambrose

[Union military stone: “Jas. A. Trosper, Co. H. 24 Ky. Inf.”; no dates on stone; Find A Grave website gives dates as Oct 14, 1839 – Oct 10, 1925]

## SPANISH AMERICAN WAR

Anders, William W. [Poster and Find A Grave gives middle name as “Walker”]  
[Military marker: “William W. Anders, Pvt. Co. I. 6 Regt. US Vol. Inf., Spanish American War, Jan 2, 1876 – Aug 14, 1955]

Arnold, William S. [Poster and Find A Grave give middle name as “Speed”]  
[Military marker: “William S. Arnold, Kentucky, Co G 18 Regt Infantry, Spanish American War, Jul 6, 1879 – Sep 30, 1959”; Civilian stone adds inscription: “Veteran of Co. G 18th Inf. and Co. H. 6th Inf.”]

Barnett, Francis G. [Poster and Find A Grave give middle name as “Gabriel”]  
[Military stone: “Francis G. Barnett, Kentucky PVT Infantry”; Jul 1, 1870 – Jun 9, 1952]

Evans, Robert [Listed on poster under World War I; could have served in both wars]  
[No photo of a stone on Find A Grave, but website lists the following information: “Ky Pvt. 154th Inf. 79th Div. Sp-Am. War”, and dates: Feb 11, 1888 – Dec 4, 1937]

Hollingsworth, Morgan [Poster and Find A Grave give first name as “John”]  
[Military marker; “Morgan Hollingsworth, Kentucky, PVT Co K 355 Infantry, World War I, May 14, 1889 – Apr 13, 1954”]

Holt, Pleas  
[Military marker: “Pleas Holt, Kentucky, PVT, 1 Btry Field Arty, Spanish American War, Mar 13, 1884 – Mar 12, 1965”]

Morgan, Chris  
[Military stone: “Corpl Co D 31st U.S. V. Inf., Born Jan 6, 1878, Died Mar 3, 1920”; Find A Grave website says, he was “Reinterred From Campbell Cemetery”]

Polly, James M.  
[Military stone: “James M. Polly, Kentucky PVT. 19 Inf., June 10, 1937”; birth date not on stone, listed on Find A Grave as 1880]

Storm, Tip  
[Could not find a stone for Tip Storm or Storms in Locust Grove Cemetery on Find A Grave website; there is a Tilford F. Storm, 20 Jan 1876 – 8 Jun 1895, but he died before the war began; no Storm or Storms with an initial “T” in their name matches the time period]

Wilder, John P.  
[Military marker: “John P. Wilder, Kentucky, PVT Co K 6 Regt US Vols, Spanish American War, Apr 19, 1872 – Nov 11, 1957”]

[May 6, 1895 – Jun 13, 1932; no military information]

Bales, William D.

[Military marker: “William D. Bales, SGT US Army, World War I, Feb 27, 1893 – Aug 31, 1979”]

[Oct 1, 1896 – Sep 15, 1974; no military information]

Baxter, Lelon Monroe

[Sep 16, 1898 – Mar 16, 1973; no military information]

Bishop, Jacob Calvin

[Feb 3, 1887 – Jul 25, 1975; no military information]

Black, Ory A.

[Military stone: “Kentucky, PVT 1 Coast Art. Corps, April 3, 1924”; birth date not on stone; info on Find A Grave lists birth as “Jan 1894”. NOTE: “Coast Art. Corps” refers to the US Army Coast Artillery Corps, an administrative corps responsible for coastal, harbor, and anti-aircraft defense of the US and its possessions between 1901 and 1950.]

Brewer, Fred

[Military marker: “Fred Brewer, PFC US Army, World War I, Jul 29, 1895 – Aug 8, 1975”]

Brock, George Moore

[Military marker: “George Moore Brock, Kentucky, PFC Co C 339 Infantry, World War I, Sep 10, 1895 – Sep 19, 1958”]

Brown, Robert Fulton

[Mar 26, 1882 – Mar 29, 1960; No military information on stone; website says “Ky. Pvt. Cas. Det. 12th Cal.”]

Browning, Orie Otto

[26 May 1898 – 6 Dec 2002; no military information]

Calia, William D.

[Military marker: “William D. Calia, Kentucky, MECH 55 Infantry, World War I, Apr 6, 1893 – May 17, 1952”]

Earls, Burd

[Military marker: “Burd Earls, PVT US Army, World War I, Mar 3, 1893 – May 7, 1970”]

Earls, Edward B.

[Military marker: “Edward B. Earls, PFC US Army, World War I, May 27, 1900 – May 14, 1991”]

Eaton, James

[Military marker: “James Eaton, Kentucky, PFC General Hospital 12, World War I, Oct 16, 1892 – May 5, 1967”]

Floyd, William Mattison

[Military marker: “William Mattison Floyd, Kentucky, SGT 254 PW Escort CO ASC, World War I, Dec 13, 1896 – Sep 9, 1959”]

[Jul 31, 1895 – May 31, 1969; No military information]

Haverly, Rufus

[Military marker: “Rufus Haverly, Kentucky, PVT 7 INF 3<sup>rd</sup> DIV, Dec 18, 1894 – Apr 26, 1934”]

Hollingsworth, Morgan

[Military marker: “Morgan Hollingsworth, Kentucky, PVT Co K 355 Infantry, World War I, May 14, 1889 – Apr 13, 1964”]

Holt, Edward

[Military marker: “Edward Holt, PVT US Army, World War I, Jul 25, 1895 – Apr 8, 1976”]

Hood, James

[Oct 26, 1881 – Feb 2, 1965; No military information]



Jones, Willie

[Military marker: “Willie Jones, Kentucky, PVT Co H 21 Engineers, World War I, Jan 14, 1889 – Sep 16, 1945”]

Karr, Ben W.

[Military marker: “Ben W. Karr, PVT US Army, Jan 30, 1904 – Feb 2, 2001”]

Kimsey, Vance W.

[Military marker: “Vance W. Kimsey, PVT Co E 49 Infantry Regt, World War I, Dec 13, 1896 – Feb 7, 1957”]

Lawson, Beddy Jack [Cannot find a stone or record for him in Locust Grove on Find A Grave]  
[There is a stone with the name “G.B. Lawson”; the website says “G.B” stands for “Gilly Beedy”; dates are Apr 7, 1899 – Dec 9, 1996; possibly the same man as “Beddy Jack” on the poster; there is also a female named “Biddie Lawson,” Aug 26, 1879 – Jun 19, 1966]

Lawson, Keith E. [Listed under World War II on poster; added to Korea per marker inscription, may have served in both wars]

[Military marker: “Keith E. Lawson, US Army, Korea, May 6, 1931 – Jan 27, 1989”]

Lee, Thomas E.

[Feb 15, 1899 – Apr 22, 1921; no military information]

Lewis, Chester [Added to Korea per website information, may have served in both wars]  
[Jul 21, 1925 – Jan 28, 1994; no photo of military stone, but website says, “Inscription: CPL US Army, Korea”]

Lewis, Henderson

[May 20, 1883 – May 18, 1952; Civilian tombstone says “War Veteran”]

Martin, Henry Lackford

[Military marker: “Henry Lackford Martin, PVT SPEC 6 CL US Army, Mar 4, 1906 – Nov 24, 1978”]

Martin, John R.

[Military marker: “John R. Martin, Kentucky, SGT CO H 17 Infantry, World War I, Oct 8, 1893 – May 14, 1957”]

McCabe, Fred Thomas

[Military marker: “Fred Thomas McCabe, Kentucky, PVT US Army, World War I, Mar 4, 1904 – Feb 14, 1965”]

Melton, Willie

[May 9, 1906 – Mar 8, 1989; no military information]

Morgan, Charley

[Military Stone: "Charley Morgan, Kentucky PVT 1 CL, 11 Field ARTY, September 11, 1933."  
Find A Grave added information: "Reinterred from Campbell Cemetery."]

Morgan, Elmer Harvey

[Military marker: "Elmer Harvey Morgan, PVT US Army, World War I, 1902-1987"; family stone gives dates as Dec 2, 1902 – Mar 10, 1987]

Newman, Claude

[Nov 29, 1905 – May 19, 1972; no military information]

Parrigan, Richard

[Military marker: "Richard Parrigan, Kentucky Pvt. Co M 1st Pioneer Inf. World War I, May 1, 1895 – Dec 18, 1971"]

Polly, William S. [Listed under World War II on poster; marker says World War I]

[Military marker: "William S. Polly, Kentucky, PVT SUP CO 69 FLD ARTY, World War I, Oct 11, 1888 – Sep 16, 1966"]

Poynter, Lionel Onel

[Military marker: "Lionel Onel Poynter, PVT US Army, World War I, Nov 8, 1892 – May 25, 1970"]

Poynter, William H. [Poster lists him in World War II also]

[Military marker: "Kentucky, SGT COA 18 Infantry, World War I, Dec 3, 1896 – Aug 1, 1968"]

Quimby, William M.

[Civilian stone: Dec 15, 1889 – Sep 19, 1940, "Veteran World War I"]

Reynolds, Hiram

[Military marker: "Hiram Reynolds, PVT US Army, World War I, Feb 13, 1893 – Apr 30, 1988"]

Roark, Jesse

[Sep 4, 1898 – Aug 11, 1972; inscription on civilian family stone adds: "PVT 1<sup>st</sup> Class CO G 18<sup>th</sup> INF 1<sup>st</sup> DIV World War I, Serving 1917 - 1920"]

Rush, Harvey

[Military marker: "Harvey Rush, Kentucky, PVT 160 Depot Brig, Oct 21, 1894 – Mar 24, 1945"]

Shepherd, Robert

[Military stone: "Robert Shepherd, Tennessee, SGT 74 CO COAST ARTY, May 6, 1879 – Mar 13, 1957"; a second stone reads: "Robert Shepherd; May 6, 1880; Served in US Army 1, YR. 10. MOS. & 28 DYS; 31, US. VOLS.; 3, YRS. 88, C.A.C.; 3, YRS. 127, C.A.C.; 3, YRS. 74, C.A.C."]

Smith, Albert

[Military marker: “Albert Smith, Ohio; PFC 1 CO COAST ARTILLERY, World War I, Jul 15, 1895 – Feb 18, 1965”]

Smith, Bealty [Could not find a stone for him – or anyone who might be him – in Locust Grove on Find A Grave]

Smith, Millard

[Military marker: “Millard Smith, Kentucky, SGT CO K 9 Infantry; World War I; DSC-SS, Jul 15, 1897 – Mar 5, 1962”; information on website: “The President of the United States of America, authorized by Act of Congress, July 9, 1918, takes pleasure in presenting the Distinguished Service Cross to Sergeant Millard Smith (ASN: 40475), United States Army, for extraordinary heroism in action while serving with Company K, 9th Infantry Regiment, 2d Division, A.E.F., near Beaumont, France, 8 November 1918. During an advance of his company, terrific machine-gun fire was encountered, the enemy being strongly entrenched in a ravine. With a patrol of ten men, Sergeant Smith attacked the position, but lost several of his men in the first encounter. With the remaining few he continued and silenced the fire of the enemy. Contributor: BarryC (47806468)”]

[Military marker: “Eugene Carter Asher, TEC 5 US Army, World War II, July 18, 1927 – Aug 1, 2007, Beloved Daddy”]

Asher, Shelby

[Military marker: “Shelby Asher, PVT US Army, World War II, Mar 30, 1919 – Dec 30, 1999”]

Baker Brack Mobley

[Military marker: “Brack Baker, S1 US Navy, World War II, Jul 1922 – Oct 16, 1997”]

Baker, Chrisley L.

[Military marker: “Chrisley L. Baker, PVT US Army, World War II, Feb. 13, 1910 – Feb 17, 1994, Purple Heart”]

Barrineau, Joseph Kirton (Rev.)

[Civilian stone: “Joseph Kirton Barrineau, Jan 4, 1923 – Jun 3, 2011; no military marker, but obituary on Find A Grave says “Purple Heart awarded for wounds received in Invasion of France.”]

Begley, Noah H.

[Military marker: “Noah H. Begley, PVT World War II, Jul 30, 1918 – Jan 19, 1996”]

Blanton, Dock

[Military marker: “Dock Blanton, SSGT US Army, World War II; Jun 28, 1922 – May 18, 1980]

Black, Earl Helton [No “Earl Helton Black” listed on Find A Grave; there is an “Earl Milton Black,” (see below) Apr 10, 1920 – Nov 24, 1973, no military information]

Black, Milton Earl

[This is probably “Earl Milton Black,” Apr 10, 1920 – Nov 24, 1973, no military information; probably the same man as “Earl Helton Black” listed above]

Black, Morris L.

[Military marker: “Morris L. Black, TEC 5 US Army, World War II, Oct 2, 1923 – May 10, 2010, Silver Star, Purple Heart”]

Brock, Sid J.

[Military marker: “Sid J. Brock, US Army, World War II, Jun 26, 1922 – Jul 20, 1984”]

Brock, Willis

[Military marker: “Willis Brock, PFC US Army, World War II, Nov 12, 1922 – Feb 8, 1992”]

Broughton, Dewey E.

[Military marker: “Dewey E. Broughton, Kentucky, PVT 1918 Service Comd Unit, World War II, Jan 2, 1914 – May 15, 1958”]

Brown, James

[Probably same man as “James L. Brown below – only one James Brown in Locust Grove per Find A Grave]

Brown, James L.

[Military marker: “James L. Brown, US Army 37<sup>th</sup> Engr, Oct 7, 1907 – Jan 25, 1964]

Bryant, William Carl

[Military marker: “William Carl Bryant, SGT US Army Air Forces, World War II, Dec 9, 1916 – Aug 10, 2003”]

Burgan, James Read

[Civilian stone: “James Read Burgan, Jan 19, 1922 – May 28, 1995”]; no military marker photo on Find A Grave, but website says, “Cox Navy WW 2”]

Burke, Florence C.

[Civilian stone: “Florence C. Burke, Dec 25, 1923 – Jan 15, 2003”]; website says “PVT US Army, World War II”]

Byrd, Cecil Herman

[Civilian stone: “Cecil Herman Byrd, Feb 15, 1926 – Mar 28, 2014; no military information]

Calia, Frank

[Military marker: “Frank Calia, Kentucky, PVT US Army, World War II, Nov 24, 1900 – Aug 31, 1972”]

Campbell, Lake L.

[Military marker: “Lake L. Campbell, Kentucky, Cox USNR, World War II, April 17, 1916 – May 10, 1966”]

Campbell, Virgil R.

[Military marker: “Virgil R. Campbell, TEC 4 US Army, World War II, May 16, 1923 – June 27, 1985”]

Campbell, Walter L.

[Military marker: "Walter L. Campbell, US Army, Sep 4, 1917 – Sep 11, 1991]

Carr, Hirdes

[Civilian stone: Hirdes Carr, May 5, 1925 – Mar 1, 1998; Find A Grave website has "TEC 5 US Army, World War II" listed as inscription, but is not visible in photo]

Carter, Arvil Eugene

[Civilian stone inscription reads: "Carter, Arvil E., Apr. 20, 1920 – Jan. 20, 1998; NC (SS) US Navy, 1940-1960, Mason"]

Carter, Carson

[no "Carson Carter" in Locust Grove; there is a "Carlston Cleveland Carter," no military information; Dec 31, 1915 – Jan 12, 1994]

Cash, Vance O.

[Military marker: "Vance O. Cash, S SGT US Army Air Forces, World War II, Mar 4, 1917 – Oct 10, 2005" and a Star of David symbol at the bottom center of the marker]

Cassidy, Rufus J.

[Military marker: "Rufus J Cassidy, PFC US Army, World War II, Jan 6, 1925 – Feb 7, 1986"]

Cassidy, Woodrow Estol

[Military marker: "Woodrow E. Cassidy, S2 US Navy, World War II, Jun 28, 1917 - Nov 20, 1991"]

No military information; Civilian stone: May 16, 1927 – Jul 26, 2013]

[Military marker: "Rodney W. Cox, Kentucky, PFC CO C 65 Signal BN, World War II, Oct 20, 1923 – Aug 16, 1964"]

Creech, Clarence

[Military marker: "Clarence Creech, TEC 5 US Army, World War II, Jan 19, 1916 – Jan 29, 1996"]

Creech, O.D.

[Mar 10, 1927 – Oct 12, 2005; no military information]

Curry, Hugh T.

[Sep 29, 1919 – Oct 11, 1998; obituary on website says: "He was an Army veteran."; no other military information on the site]

Day, Henderson Leon Sr. [Mar 28, 1927 – Jul 6, 2010; no military information]

Day, Oscar Jock [Marker omits middle name]
